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**Report on the discovery of
a coffin in the Tomb No.-28 - Asasif**



In 18th november, 2015, the Spanish Archaeological Mission of the 'Institute of Studies of Ancient Egypt', it has been the discover the intact burial place with a coffin belonging to ***'Osiris Uab (Priest) of Amun-Re, King of the Gods, Scribe of divine offerings at the House of Amun, Ankh-ef-Khonsu'***.

His conditions of preservation are good in general.

His typology: The XXIIth. Dynasty

Description: Coffin of man with tripartite wig, with stripes and a floral Crown, he carries braided beard. A broad collar 'Usekh' protects the neck and shoulders. The Mummy wrapping show the two hands crossed, carrying two stems of papyrus. A broad necklace 'Usekh' protects the neck and shoulders. Three columns of text are distinguished in the Center ranging from under arms up to the feet. The box of the coffin is decorated with several records with the deceased making offerings to the gods Osiris, Nefertem, Anubis, the goddess Hathor, as a cow, and the Lady of the West, with hieroglyphic texts.
